

The Acute Withdrawal Unit is in Berrimah which operates seven days a week, 24 hours a day, admissions are arranged during business hours. AOD specialist services can provide medical supervision and monitoring of patients withdrawing from alcohol and other drugs. AOD operating hours are 8 am till 4.21 pm Monday to Friday. In an urgent situation individuals may present to their closest emergency department or clinic. Katherine Hospital and Gove District Hospital both offer medical supervision and monitoring of patients withdrawing from alcohol and other drugs.


